

RESOLUTION No. 2007-035

**A RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS
OF OURAY COUNTY, COLORADO TO BAN OPEN FIRES WITHIN THE CERTAIN
UNINCORPORATED AREAS OF OURAY COUNTY, COLORADO**

WHEREAS, the Board of County Commissioners of Ouray County, Colorado (“Board”) is empowered under C.R.S. §30-11-107(e) to provide for the management of the business and concerns of the County; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to C.R.S. §30-15-401(1)(n.5), the Board has the power to adopt an ordinance to ban open fires to a degree and in a manner that is deemed necessary to reduce the danger of wildfires; and

WHEREAS, the Board adopted Ordinance No. 02-01 on June 3, 2002 entitled “Ordinance Concerning the Ban of Open Fires, Contained Open Fires and Fireworks”; and

WHEREAS, the Board has received competent evidence that there exists within certain unincorporated areas of Ouray County, Colorado a high danger of forest and grass fires; and

WHEREAS, the weather conditions and lack of precipitation have caused a threat of fire in the forests and in certain unincorporated areas of Ouray County, Colorado and a current state of emergency exists with respect to fire danger; and

WHEREAS, the Ouray County Sheriff has recommended that the Board impose a ban on all open fires and fireworks within certain unincorporated areas of Ouray County, Colorado;

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF OURAY COUNTY, COLORADO, AS FOLLOWS:

1. All open fires, fireworks and public fireworks displays are banned within the following unincorporated areas of Ouray County, Colorado:

Within the boundaries of the Loghill Mesa Fire Protection District
Within the area of the Horsefly Fire Association

“Open Fire” is defined in Ordinance No. 02-01 as:

“Open fires shall mean: any open burning, including camp and cooking fires; except smoking within an enclosed vehicle or building, a developed recreation site, or while in an area at least ten feet (10’) in diameter that is barren or cleared of all flammable material; or welding, or operating an acetylene or other torch with open flame. Open fires shall not include:

a. Fires in camp stoves or grills, fueled by bottle gas or pressurized liquid, and specifically designed for cooking or heating purposes.

b. Fires in permanently constructed stationary masonry or metal fire-places specifically designed for the purpose of combustion.

c. Fires in commercially operated wood and/or charcoal fired grills designed for cooking.”

“Fireworks” is defined in Ordinance No. 02-01 as:

“Fireworks shall mean: any article, device, or substance prepared for the primary purpose of producing a visual or auditory sensation by combustion, explosion, deflagration or detonation which meets the description of fireworks as set forth in the United States Department of Transportation Hazardous Materials Regulations, Title 49, Code of Federal Regulations, Parts 173.88 and 173.100.”

“Public Fireworks display” is defined in Ordinance No. 02-01 as:

“Public fireworks displays shall mean: - any display of fireworks conducted by a qualified pyrotechnic operator conducted only after approval by the local fire authority and in compliance with any conditions imposed by the local fire authority.”

2. Notwithstanding the provisions of Ordinance No. 02-01, because of the very high fire danger, and pursuant to the Board’s authority contained in C.R.S. § 30-15-401(1)(n.5), a ban on charcoal grill fires is also imposed.

3. This fire ban shall be effective as of 12:00 a.m. July 3, 2007 and shall remain in effect until August 31, 2007, unless removed earlier by resolution.

4. Notwithstanding the provisions of this fire ban Resolution, the Ouray County Sheriff is authorized to exempt from the fire ban any open fire, approved in advance by the Sheriff, after inspection of the containment structure, surrounding vegetation and the potential fire fuel and the immediate availability of fire suppression apparatus.
